

Press Release: Signing of the Financing Contract for Project ROMD00184– FAST “Forest firefighting with aerial support”

On October 28, 2025 the financing contract was signed for project ROMD00184 – FAST “Forest firefighting with aerial support”.

The project is funded by the European Union through the Neighbourhood, Development and International Cooperation Instrument (NDICI), under the Interreg NEXT Romania–Republic of Moldova Programme 2021–2027, Priority 1 – Green Communities, Specific Objective 1.1 – Promoting climate change adaptation, disaster risk prevention and resilience, taking into account ecosystem-based approaches.

The specific objective of this project is improving joint response in emergency situations in the cross-border area through common trainings and procurement of specialized equipment.

The project partnership includes three institutions from Romania and one from the Republic of Moldova, as follows:

- Lead Partner: General Inspectorate for Emergency Situations, Bucharest, Romania;
- PP 2: General Inspectorate of Aviation of the Ministry of Internal Affairs, Bucharest, Romania;
- PP 3: The Inspectorate for Emergency Situations “Mihail Sturdza” OF Iasi County, Romania;
- PP 4: Hincesti District Emergency Situations Directorate, Republic of Moldova;

The project implementation period is from 28.10.2025 – 28.04.2027.

The total project budget amounts to 313.018,68 Euro, of which 281.716,81 EUR is non-reimbursable funding.
